

EARTHQUAKE

A moderate earthquake of magnitude 5.1 Richter Scale with its epicentre Myanmar Sea (about 80 miles southeast of Pyapon), latitude 15.24 °N, longitude 96.24 °E, depth 10 kilometres, about 111 miles south of the Kaba Aye Seismological Observatory was recorded at 23 hours 35 minutes 30 seconds MST on 30 August 2025. — DMH

Residents Urged to Prioritize Public Safety Amid Armed Terrorist Threats

ARMED terrorists have been launching attacks by using residential homes and administrative buildings in towns and villages as cover, where they have forcibly settled. They aim to shield themselves from Tatmadaw counterattacks while also persuading temporarily displaced persons to return to their native areas and recruiting new members. That enables terrorists to use civilians as human shields. Tatmadaw is committed to safeguarding the sovereignty of the State and will respond to these threats based on intelligence and prevailing conditions. Therefore, residents in areas where terrorists have taken control must prioritize their safety and protect themselves from being exploited by these groups.

China vows support for Myanmar's SCO entry

is a dialogue partner of the SCO and participated in the Anti-Fascist War. China and Myanmar are neighbouring countries in a strong Swemyo Pauk-Phaw relationship. China always stands with Myanmar and supports the development and stability of Myanmar. China supports the political system of Myanmar and firmly stands with Myanmar for the development of its people and the construction of a peaceful and prosperous community sharing the same fortune between the two countries. He pledged that China will uphold the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence between countries.

In his response, the Senior General said that Myanmar launched its anti-Fascist movement on 27 March 1945. The Armed Forces Day of Myanmar Tatmadaw was designated as 27 March, the day marking the resistance against fascism. The Armed Forces Day was observed for its 80th anniversary on 27 March 2025. The Shanghai Cooperation Organization Summit is reliable for the

enhancement of international cooperation. Myanmar became a dialogue partner of the SCO in May 2023 and has been attending the summits from then on. The Senior General requested that China recommend that Myanmar become a member of the SCO. The Senior General expressed his firm belief that this meeting will further promote the good relationship between the two countries

They cordially widely discussed cooperation in peace processes of Myanmar, promotion of trade, enhancement of implementing the OBOR project and the China-Myanmar Economic Corridor (CMEC), efficient utilization of natural resources, giving aid to Myanmar related to the devastating Mandalay earthquake, placing special emphasis on support and standing of China with Myanmar in the international landscape, further enhancement of relationship between the two countries, efforts to hold a multiparty democratic general eleciton on 28 December in Myanmar, and invitation to international electoral

observation groups to Myanmar.

The Chinese President expressed his wide scope of discussions on matters for continued implementation, which were agreed upon during the meeting between the Chinese and Myanmar leaders in Moscow in May 2025, opposing external interference in Myanmar's politics, promotion of China-Myanmar strategic cooperation, positive standing of China to ensure peace and stability of Myanmar and further action plans, and standing of Myanmar with prestige and integrity in the international landscape and relations with regional organizations.

They also reciprocally discussed support of China for Myanmar's preparations to hold the multiparty democratic general election and further measures to be taken through the diplomatic channel, a pledge to recommend Myanmar to become an SCO member country, and further discussions between relevant departments for multi-sectoral cooperation between the two countries. — MNA/TTA

The groups discussed different topics, and one youth representative of each group compiled the discussions.


The region's social affairs minister, who is also the Yangon Region Youth Affairs Committee vice-chairperson, made a concluding remark.

KNU declared as terrorist organization

The Counter-Terrorism Central Committee, with the approval of the Union Government and under the authority granted by Subsection (e) of Section 6 and Subsection (b) of Section 72 of the Counter-Terrorism Law, hereby issued the declaration in accord with its notification 1/2025. Hence, the Kayin National Union (KNU), which is committing the above-mentioned acts of terrorism, is hereby declared a terrorist organization.

KNU declared an unlawful association

The Acting President affirms that the objectives and activities of the Kayin National Union (KNU), its members, affiliated organizations, and associated individuals pose serious threats to the rule of law in the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, as well as to the peace, stability, and well-being of the State and its people. Therefore, under Section 16 of the Unlawful Associations Act, the Acting President has declared the above-mentioned organization, along with its affiliated bodies, as unlawful associations in accordance with Subsection 2 of Section 15 of the Act, according to the notification 922/2025 of the Ministry of Home Affairs. — GNLM/TTA

CBM sells over THB1M, CNY849K on 29 Aug

THE Central Bank of Myanmar (CBM) injected 849,825 yuan and one million baht into the financial market on 29 August after the sales of over US\$1.67 million to edible oil-importing companies and over \$242,000 to those who made non-trade payments.

CBM sold over \$1.9 million to edible oil-importing companies and \$727,500 to fuel oil-importing companies on 28 August, in addition to an injection of 66,150 yuan in the market.

Moreover, CBM sold \$127,894 to CMP companies and those who made non-trade payments.

CBM sold over 925,900 yuan and over one million baht on 27 August. Furthermore, it sold \$735,040 to edible oil-importing companies, over \$723,000 to fuel oil-importing companies, and over \$350,000 to CMP companies and individuals who made nontrade payments.

CBM announced on 26 August that it would sell \$32 million and 15 million yuan to importers of other commodities.

CBM also sold \$930,000 to

edible oil-importing companies, \$260,354 to fuel oil-importing companies and over \$452,280 to CMP companies and those who made non-trade payments.

CBM sold over \$444,430 to edible oil-importing companies and \$390,000 to fuel oil-importing

companies on 25 August after the sales of over \$29,440 to those who made non-trade payments.

CBM pumped \$1.177 million into edible oil-importing companies and over \$287,600 into fuel oil-importing companies on 22 August, after the sales of 500,000

baht

Furthermore, it sold over \$102,700 to companies working on a Cut, Make and Pack basis and those who made non-trade payments.

CBM sold \$36.5 million purchased from companies working

on a Cut, Make and Pack basis, in addition to the injection of \$8.8 million, 13.3 million baht, 10.5 million yuan and 500,000 rupees in July. Furthermore, CBM sold over \$2.3 million to other commodities-importing companies as per its initial announcement of selling \$10 million. CBM sold \$8.4 million, 13.9 million baht and 5.2 million yuan in June 2025, in addition to the injection of \$14.9 million that was purchased from the CMP enterprises into the financial market. CBM aims to curb the instability in the foreign exchange market and currency devaluation. According to CBM's notification on 15 March 2024, it has been collaborating with law enforcement agencies to combat and prosecute those who attempt to manipulate the currency market under the existing laws. CBM allowed authorized dealers (private banks) to operate online foreign exchange trading freely as per the market rate, depending on supply and demand, starting from 5 December 2023. — NN/KK

Leverage up expansion of sown acreage for oil crops

AS IT is important for the expansion of sown acreage to grow oil crops, farmers emphasize the cultivation of oil crops Tis important for the expansion of sown acreage to grow such as groundnut, sesame, and sunflower in designated special zones. However, the target cultivation and production have not yet been fully achieved up to now. As such, it is necessary to expand the sunflower cultivation due to giving directive given since 2022 to effectively secure success.

Sunflower cultivation should be expanded to ensure a sufficient domestic edible oil supply and to enable exports. Expanding the sown acreage of sunflowers can increase yield, shorten the growing period, simplify farming, and contribute to the nation's economic development. With higher sunflower oil production, the country's domestic edible oil demand can be reduced, import dependency on foreign countries minimized, and foreign currency expenditure

According to the statistics, it is expected that for Myanmar's estimated population of 51.3 million, calculating at an annual per capita consumption rate of six visses, the country would require 500,000 tonnes of edible oil. Based on the current vields of cultivated groundnut, sesame, sunflower, canola, and safflower, domestic production of edible oil could theoretically meet national demand. However, since groundnut and sesame are also consumed as whole seeds domestically and exported abroad, there will still be a requirement to ensure a sufficient edible oil supply within the country.


As such, it is necessary to further expand the cultivation of sunflowers, which can be used exclusively for edible oil. Currently, about US\$500 million worth of edible oil is imported annually from abroad. To reduce these imports, it is essential to increase domestic cultivation of oil-yielding crops

such as sunflowers.

governments.

Sunflower oil is a high-quality edible one that is beneficial for health and is also a marketable crop. If cultivated and produced systematically, it can increase farmers' incomes. Furthermore, unlike the practice of focusing exclusively on rice and legumes, sunflowers can be widely grown as a single crop, enabling farmers to achieve crop diversification on their fields. Moreover, rotating sunflower cultivation helps maintain soil nutrient levels.

Therefore, to ensure affordable edible oil prices for consumers, sustain the operation of domestic oil mills, and reduce the prices of oil crop raw materials, the expansion of oil crop cultivation must be implemented as a national policy. To achieve this, efforts to increase cultivation areas and enhance crop yields must be successfully carried out under the leadership of state and regional governments.


This book focuses on how the Buddha viewed the development of various human intelligences (Multiple Intelligences) as part of his teaching methods 2,600 years ago, using many references.

references to commentaries (At-




Some excerpts from this book are that the Dhamma is just a relative value to reach Nibbana. A powerful metaphor for the Buddha's teaching in Chinese Buddhism, "the Dhamma is like a finger pointing to the moon," means that if we focus solely on the finger, we will miss the moon. In turn, we cannot see the moon if we ignore the finger as well (the teachings) and not the truth and reality (the moon), which serves as a tool to guide practitioners towards the ultimate truth and reality through the teachings.

Impermanence (Anicca) and no-self (Anatta) state that there is no unchanging self or soul within living beings (animate) or any phenomenon (inanimate). The profound implication of Paticcasamuppada depicts the concepts of interconnectedness, emphasizing that all phenomena happen due to other factors and conditions, and nothing exists independently.

Buddhist teaching pointed out the true nature of dynamic and interdependent entities (body and mind). No permanent self or essence can be found by clinging to a solid ego.

This foundational piece of writing that synthesizes the deep truth and pragmatic guidance from Buddhist teachings is a must-read book for those interested in early Buddhist teachings from the modern point of view. This book will offer new insights into Buddhism by presenting its core teachings in accessible ways and providing a different lens through which readers can gain a transformative perspective on life grounded in the Middle Way.

MNA plans Lashio flight restart


MYANMAR National Airlines (MNA) has been arranging to resume suspended flights to Lashio as soon as possible.

GDP growth reflects India's broader economic progress: Petroleum Minister Puri

India's economy registered a growth of 7.8 per cent in the first quarter (April-June) of the 2025-26 financial year.

MINISTER of Petroleum and Natural Gas Hardeep Singh Puri said on Saturday that the changes in GDP figures are translating into growth in other areas.

Talking to reporters in the national capital, Puri said, "As we grow as an economy, today we are a \$4.3 trillion economy, but the changes are not just GDP figures, but how it's translating into other parts."

He praised the GDP growth figures for the last quarter, adding that "7.8 per cent was the rate of growth of GDP in the last quarter. In the preceding quarter, it was 7.4 per cent. So, I think that we are not just the world's fastest-growing large economy,

but these figures are remarkable in themselves."

"If you look at the overall activity, how is the energy consumption taking place here — India's energy consumption is three times higher than the global number...If the economy is doing well, energy consumption will go up," Puri further added.

According to the government data released on Friday, India's economy surged ahead with a robust 7.8 per cent growth in Q1 of FY 2025-26, exceeding the Reserve Bank of India's projection of 6.5 per cent and marking the highest quarterly increase in five quarters.

Canada's GDP down 0.4% in Q2

CANADA'S real gross domestic product declined 0.4 per cent in the second quarter of this year, following a 0.5 per cent gain in the first quarter, said Statistics Canada on Friday.

The contraction was driven by significant declines in the export of goods, as well as decreased business investment in machinery and equipment, said the national statistical agency.

According to the agency, exports fell 7.5 per cent. International exports of passenger cars and light trucks plummeted 24.7 per cent in the second quarter as a consequence of tariffs imposed by the United States. Exports of industrial machinery, equipment and parts dropped 18.5 per cent, while travel services also declined 11.1 per cent.

These declines were tempered by faster accumulations of business inventories, higher household spending and lower imports of goods, the agency added. — Xinhua

Philippine central bank welcomes Moody's assessment of country's external sector

THE Philippine central bank, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP), on Saturday said it welcomed the favourable assessment by credit rating agency Moody's of the country's access to external financing.

In its latest ratings review — a report that follows a rating action — Moody's

noted the country's access to domestic and international funding markets as well as the "ample foreign-currency reserves". These are seen to help the economy "weather global capital flows volatility".

Moody's assessment followed its affirmation of the Baa2 rating (moderate credit risk) and stable outlook in August 2024.

As of the end of July 2025, the Philippines' gross international reserves stood at US\$105.4 billion, equivalent to 7.2 months' worth of imports and about 3.4 times the country's short-term external debt based on residual maturity, the BSP said.

US appeals court finds Trump's global tariffs illegal

A US appeals court on Friday ruled that many of President Donald Trump's tariffs, which have upended global trade, were illegal — but allowed them to remain in place for now, giving him time to take the fight to the Supreme Court.

The 7-4 ruling by the US Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit affirmed a lower court's finding that Trump had exceeded his authority in tapping emergency economic powers to impose wide-ranging duties.

But the judges allowed the tariffs to stay in place through mid-October—and Trump swiftly made clear he would put the time to use

The appeals court "incorrectly said that our Tariffs should be removed, but they know the United States of America will win in the end", he said in a statement on his Truth Social platform lashing out at the ruling.

He added that he would fight back "with the help of the United States Supreme Court". — AFP

US banana giant Chiquita returns to Panama

US banana giant Chiquita Brands will resume operations in Panama and rehire thousands of workers fired after a crippling strike, the government of the Central American country said Friday.

Chiquita closed its Changuinola plant in the Caribbean province of Bocas del Toro at the end of May and laid off 6,000 workers after a strike over pension reforms that crippled production for weeks. The strike, declared illegal by a labor court, caused more than \$75 million in losses as well as road closures and product shortages in the province. The Panamanian government has been negotiating with the company for its return to Bocas del Toro, which relies heavily on tourism and banana production.

Japan's 2025 rice crop outlook favourable, shortage likely to ease

RICE production in 13 of Japan's 47 prefectures in 2025 is expected to exceed that of the previous year and remain mostly unchanged in 29 prefectures, an outlook from the farm ministry showed Friday, raising hopes that the country's rice shortage will soon be resolved. With just four prefectures projected to see lower rice yield per unit area than the previous year as of 15 August the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries has concluded that overall harvest conditions are favorable.

Okinawa Prefecture was not included in the outlook as some of the figures from the region have yet to be tabulated.

Land for cultivation in 2025 is expected to expand by about 100,000 hectares compared with the previous year. Assuming regular crop conditions, the ministry forecasts that brown rice production will increase by 560,000 tonnes to around 7.35 million tonnes.

A significant shortfall was seen in 2024, when demand reached 7.11 million tonnes, while only 6.79 million tonnes of rice was produced. The rise has been mainly driven by reduced distribution volumes, due in part to heat damage and pest outbreaks, with some also attributing it to demand from booming inbound tourism. — Kyodo

US Spirit Airlines files for bankruptcy again

BUDGET US carrier Spirit Airlines said Friday that it will file for bankruptcy for the second time in a year, but will continue to fly, sell tickets and operate.

Spirit first filed for bankruptcy in November and announced in March that it had completed a restructuring deal with creditors to trim its debt by nearly \$800 million.

With the new filing, the Florida-based company said it "expects to double down on its efforts to" redesign its network,

"rightsize its fleet", and pursue further cost efficiencies

"The Chapter 11 process will provide Spirit the tools, time and flexibility to continue ongoing discussions with all of its lessors, financial creditors and other parties to implement a financial and operational transformation of the Company," Spirit said in a statement.

In April, former CEO Ted Christie was replaced by Dave Davis, who joined Spirit from Sun Country Airlines.

"As we move forward, guests can continue to rely on Spirit to provide high-value travel options and connect them with the people and places that matter most," said Dave Davis, Spirit's president and CEO. — AFP

Cash-strapped Taliban look to airspace for windfall

FAR above Kabul, the cash-strapped Taliban government has located a potentially lucrative revenue stream: Afghanistan's airspace.

As Israel and Iran's exchange of missiles threw flight paths into disarray this year, the skies above Afghanistan offered carriers a less turbulent

and faster route to ply — for a flat \$700 overflight fee, according to industry insiders.

The US aviation authority eased restric-

tions on the country's airspace and paved the way for commercial flyovers in 2023, two years after the Taliban takeover.

Nearly 500,000 displaced by floods in eastern Pakistan

NEARLY half a million people have been displaced by flooding in eastern Pakistan after days of heavy rain swelled rivers, relief officials said Saturday, as they carried out a massive rescue operation.

Three transboundary rivers that cut through Punjab province have swollen to exceptionally high levels, affecting more than 2,300 villages.

Nabeel Javed, the head of the Punjab government's relief services, said 481,000 people stranded by the floods have been evacuated, along with 405,000 livestock.

Overall, more than 1.5 million people have been affected by the flooding.

This is the biggest rescue operation in Punjab's history.

He said more than 800 boats and some 1,300 rescue personnel were involved in evacuating families from affected areas. — AFP

Cook stays on Fed board pending ruling

A US court on Friday began hearing Federal Reserve Governor Lisa Cook's challenge of President Donald Trump's attempt to fire her, in a legal battle set to have major implications for the US central bank and its independence.

The session ended with no immediate ruling, with more arguments to be submitted Tuesday. In the first hearing in the case, a judge in Washington considered Cook's request for a temporary

order declaring Trump's attempt to oust her unlawful.

This would allow Cook — the first Black woman to serve on the Fed's board — to continue in her role while she challenges her ouster. Judge Jia Cobb, who was appointed under former president Joe Biden's administration, heard arguments from lawyers representing Cook and Trump respectively. — AFP

AUGUST 27

Japan denies promoting immigration from Africa

THE Japanese government on Tuesday denied promoting immigration from Africa as it scrambles to dispel misinformation stemming from the designation of "Africa Hometown" cities following a Japan-led conference on African development.

After the Japan International Cooperation Agency designated four Japanese cities on Thursday for strengthening exchanges with the continent, the city governments have been deluged with protest calls and emails, including allegations that increasing migrants from Africa would worsen public order.

The Foreign Ministry said Monday that Tokyo has "no plans to take measures to promote the acceptance of immigrants or issue special visas for residents of African countries." "There have been reports and statements both domestically and internationally that contain information contrary to the facts," the ministry said in a statement, stressing that the government-linked aid agency known as JICA only plans to promote exchanges through various activities. — Kyodo

AUGUST 28

China-Arab Expo important platform for B&R cooperation

SINCE the launch in 2013, the China-Arab States Expo has been an important platform for Belt and Road cooperation between China and Arab states, and China stands ready to work with Arab states to carry forward the spirit of China-Arab friendship, and promote the building of a China-Arab community with a shared future, a Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson said.

The seventh China-Arab States Expo opened in Yinchuan, northwest China's Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region Thursday.

Spokesperson Guo Jiakun told a regular press conference that this expo is themed "Innovation, Green Development and Prosperity," focuses on digital economy, clean energy, artificial intelligence, modern agriculture, water resources, smart meteorology and other trending topics, and is expected to reach a good number of results. — Xinhua

AUGUST 26

UAE delivers 81st Gaza aid airdrop

THE UAE, in collaboration with Jordan, Germany, and Indonesia, conducted its 81st humanitarian airdrop of essential food supplies into the Gaza Strip on 26 August 2025.

This was part of the "Birds of Goodness" operation, highlighting sustained international efforts to alleviate the dire humanitarian conditions faced by the population.

The latest airdrop brings the total relief supplied by air under this operation to over 4,076 tonnes. The delivery, supported by Emirati charities, is a continued effort to meet the urgent needs of Gaza's residents amidst ongoing crises.

According to the state news agency WAM, cited by ANI, this reinforces regional and global cooperation in providing assistance to the Palestinian people.

The ongoing operation underscores the UAE's commitment to supporting the Palestinian people and strengthening their resilience in the face of hardship. — ANI

AUGUST 25

China's Haiqin ROV completes deep-sea mission

CHINA'S self-developed Haiqin, a 6,000-metre deep-sea remotely operated vehicle (ROV), has successfully completed a deep-sea voyage in the South China Sea, scientists have told Xinhua.

The deep-sea electric ROV system named Haiqin, which was designed and built by Shanghai Jiao Tong University, reached a depth of 4,140 metres during the sea trial early on Saturday morning.

Equipped with high-definition cameras, robotic arms, sonar systems and sensors — the ROV demonstrated capabilities including automatic heading control and precise hovering. The 3.6-tonne ROV successfully collected deep-sea biological samples and sediments. This voyage also saw the simultaneous deployment of the full-ocean-depth autonomous and remotely-operated vehicle (ARV) named Haidou-1. — Xinhua

AUGUST 24

Russia and Ukraine each send back 146 POWs

RUSSIA and Ukraine each sent back 146 prisoners of war on Sunday, Moscow's defence ministry said, the latest in a series of exchanges that has seen hundreds of POWs released this year.

Large-scale prisoner exchanges were the only tangible result of three rounds of talks between Russian and Ukrainian delegations in Istanbul between May and July.

They remain one of the few areas of cooperation between the two countries since Russia's military operation began in 2022.

"On 24 August, 146 Russian servicemen were returned from the territory controlled" by Kyiv, the Russian defence ministry said on Telegram.

"In exchange, 146 prisoners of war of the Ukrainian Armed Forces were transferred" to Ukraine, it added. — AFP

Chelsea benefit from VAR controversy to beat Fulham

CHELSEA took advantage of VAR controversy to beat Fulham 2-0 as the visitors were left to rue a series of costly decisions awarded against them at Stamford Bridge on Saturday.

Enzo Maresca's side were fortunate not to fall behind in the west London derby when Fulham were harshly denied a first half opener.

Josh King's strike was ruled out after VAR deemed Rodrigo Muniz's accidental collision with Trevoh Chalobah was worthy of a foul. As if that wasn't infuriating enough for Fulham boss Marco Silva, Joao Pedro put Chelsea ahead beyond the scheduled eight minutes of stoppage-time

at the end of the first half.

Adding to Silva's anger, Chelsea's second goal was also VAR-influenced as Ryan Sessegnon was adjudged to have handled a cross, leading to Enzo Fernandez converting from the penalty spot. After drawing with Crystal Palace and routing West Ham 5-1, Chelsea's third successive Premier League clash with a London rival extended their unbeaten start to three games.

Alejandro Garnacho watched from the stands at Stamford Bridge after the Argentine winger travelled to Chelsea's training ground on Friday to finalize his move from Manchester United.

Djokovic overcomes Norrie to make US Open last 16

NOVAK Djokovic beat Britain's Cameron Norrie in four sets on Friday to became the oldest man to reach the US Open last 16 since Jimmy Connors in 1991.

The 38-year-old Djokovic

earned a record 192nd Grand Slam match win on hard courts as he defeated Norrie 6-4, 6-7 (4/7), 6-2, 6-3, staying in the hunt for an unprecedented 25th major title. "Coming into any match you

really want to win in straight sets without any drama but obviously that's not possible," said Djokovic.

"It's good that I get tested. I obviously haven't had any matches since Wimbledon. "I'm still trying to find my rhythm and my groove on the court". Djokovic has now defeated Norrie in all seven of their meetings and is through to the fourth round in

New York for the 16th time in his career. On Sunday he will play German veteran Jan-Lennard Struff, who has already knocked out two seeds in Holger Rune and Frances Tiafoe. — AFP

The Humanoid Xiao He further added, "My systems integrate advanced emotional recognition algorithms, adaptive learning modules and comprehensive knowledge databases to facilitate seamless communication between international delegates, media personnel and sum-

mit organisers. My operational parameters emphasise cultural neutrality, factual precision and continuous performance optimization throughout the summit duration". Highlighting its proficiency in three languages, it also provided details of the arrangements at the summit. — ANI

Exhausted Scottish brothers back on shore after record Pacific row

THREE Scottish brothers from Edinburgh — Ewan, Jamie, and Lachlan MacLean — completed a record-breaking 139-day, 9,000-mile non-stop, unsupported row across the Pacific Ocean from Peru to Australia.

Departing from Lima in April, they faced violent storms, exhaustion, sickness, and near disaster when Ewan was swept overboard but rescued. Despite fears of running out of food, they persevered and arrived in Cairns, Australia, greeted by family, friends, and a traditional bagpipe welcome. Their journey set the record for the fastest human-powered crossing of the full Pacific Ocean without stops or support.

The brothers expressed relief and joy at returning to solid ground and enjoying proper food, with Jamie's first meal being pizza. Their feat attracted support from celebrities like Mark Wahlberg and Ewan McGregor.

The mid-Pacific route is more

commonly travelled, but few have attempted the full crossing from South America to Australia.

The brothers credited their teamwork and mutual support for overcoming setbacks and emotional challenges. They undertook the expedition to raise funds for clean water projects in Madagascar. Previously, in 2020, they broke three world records rowing across the Atlantic Ocean in 35 days, despite having no professional rowing experience. — AFP

Austria orders YouTube to comply with GDPR

YouTube must provide user data access under EU regulations.

AUSTRIA'S data protection authority said Friday that it has ordered YouTube to comply with EU regulations and respond to requests by users for access to data that it holds on them.

In 2019, prominent Austria-based privacy campaign group Noyb (None of Your Business) lodged complaints against eight online streaming services, including YouTube and Netflix, accusing them of "structural violations" of EU data regulations. The complaint against YouTube was filed on behalf of an Austrian user with the country's Data Protection Authority. The regulator confirmed to AFP on Friday that it had "issued a decision... against Google LLC (YouTube)" regarding the suit brought by Noyb. In their complaints, Noyb said the services violated the EU's landmark General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) by not granting users access to data that companies store on them or information about how the data is used. — AFP
