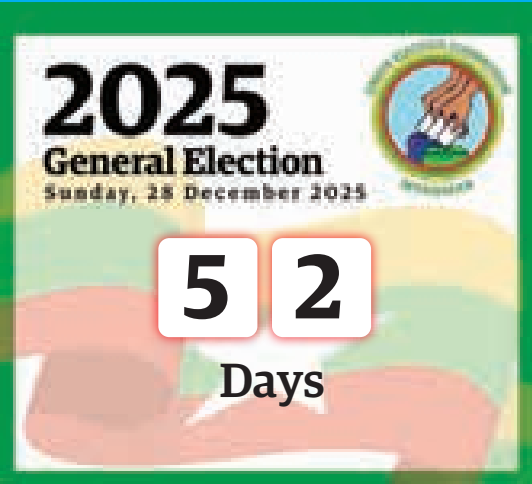

2025 MULTIPARTY DEMOCRACY GENERAL ELECTION

- Domestic election observers who wish to monitor the multiparty democratic general election, which will begin in phases on 28 December 2025, may apply for election observation permits at the Union Election Commission (UEC), as well as the relevant Region/State, District, and Township Election Subcommissions from today until 5 December 2025.
- The Union Election Commission announced on 16 September 2025 that domestic election observers must follow the Code of Conduct for Observers, issued under Notification 68/2025, and adhere to the procedures set out for their observation activities under Notification 69/2025. These notifications are available for viewing and can be downloaded from the Union Election Commission’s official website <https://www.uec.gov.mm>.
- The Union Election Commission has also announced that international election observers will be allowed to monitor the multiparty democratic general election. Invitations will be extended directly to representatives of relevant countries and international organizations. In addition, through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, invitations will be sent to representatives of foreign embassies, consulates, and permanent missions that maintain diplomatic relations with the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

Typhoon “KALMAEGI” Condition
According to the observations at 3:30 pm MST today, the Typhoon “KALMAEGI” over the South China Sea has moved west-northwestwards and persists.

Next 36 hours forecast
It is forecast likely to continue to move west-northwestwards and may cross the Vietnam coast on night of 6 November 2025.

General Caution
Due to the remnant of cloud from Typhoon “KALMAEGI”, rain or thundershowers will be fairly widespread to widespread in Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon, Bago, Ayeyawady and Taninthayi regions and Kayah, Kayin, Mon, Rakhine and (southern and eastern) Shan states with regionally and isolated heavy falls in some region during 8 November 2025 to 10 November 2025. Squalls with moderate to rough seas are likely at times in the Deltaic, the Gulf of Mottama, off and along Mon,Taninthayi Coasts. Surface wind speed in squalls may reach 25-30 miles per hour. Wave height will be about 7-9 feet the Deltaic, the Gulf of Mottama, off and along the Mon,Taninthayi Coasts.

People should be aware of natural disasters such as heavy rainfalls with strong wind, thunder, lightning strikes, lightning, hail, flash floods and landslides in hilly areas and near small rivers and to make necessary preparations for inland water transport, domestic flights and irrigation dams. — DMH

THE Taunggyi Tazaungdine Festival in Taunggyi, Shan State (South), has been celebrated as a competition since 1312 ME (1950 AD). During the hot-air balloon festival, competitions are traditionally held in two categories: daytime balloons and nighttime balloons.

The balloons released in the daytime are especially the toys (two or four legs), and the nighttime balloons are Nyameegyi (balloons with fireworks) and Seinnapan (decorated with candles). Visitors across the nation come and enjoy the festival happily and peacefully.

This year, the Taunggyi Tazaungdine hot air balloon festival was started on 29 October in Awayya ground, and the contestants, companies and other participants from the vicinity areas of Taunggyi participated in the event with dance, and there are about 250,000 people daily during the festival days.

A total of 25 22-foot-high Nyameegyi, 18 25-foot-high Nyameegyi, 37 18-foot-high Seinnapan, totalling 80 balloons, whereas 193 two-legged balloons, 93 four-legged balloons, 75 balloon groups, totalling 361, will be launched during the festival. The daytime schedule is from noon to 4 pm, and the nighttime schedule is from 6:30 pm to the end of the festival.

The festival also features music concerts, traditional dance performances, the Kathina festival, the Matho robe weaving event and the lighting festival.

Although the Taunggyi Tazaungdine festival was scheduled from 29 October to 5 November, the festival period was extended to further three days until 8 November due to the current weather conditions. — MNA/KTZH

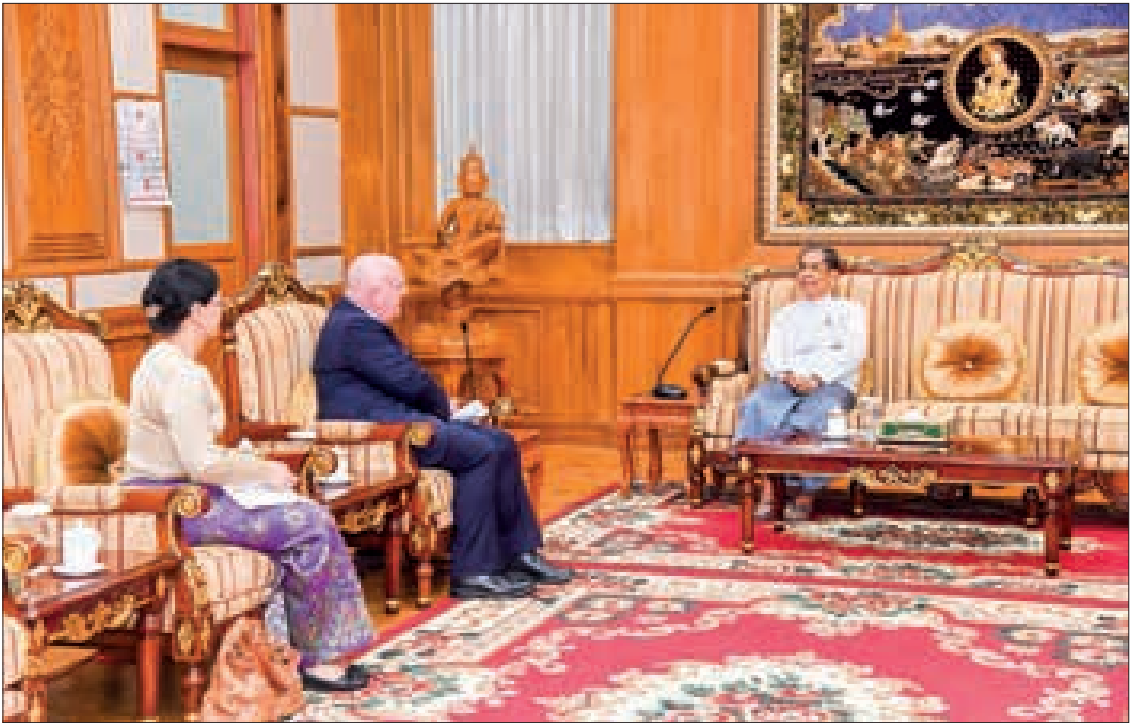
President's Office Ministry 2 Union Minister receives Head of UNOCHA Myanmar

He also met the president, general secretary and executive members of UMFCCI at its office, and discussed business-related matters and further investment.

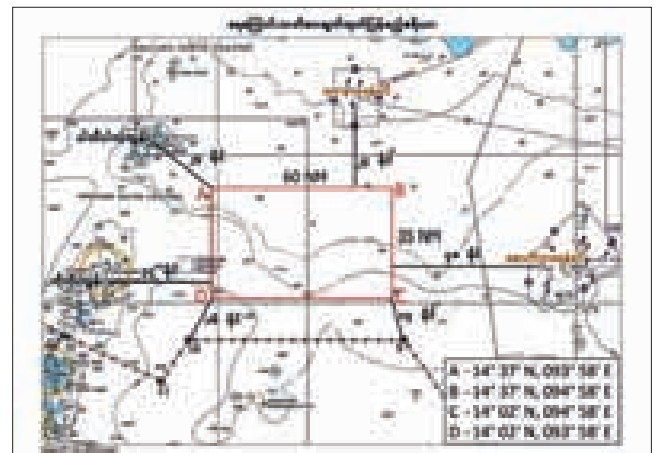
The Russian delegation visited the Shwedagon Pagoda and observed the religious

Maritime and Aerial Warnings Issued

1. The naval maritime exercises will be conducted within Myanmar's territorial waters from 7 to 8 November 2025, involving surface and aerial fire drills. The designated area for naval exercise is defined by the coordinates – Point A: Latitude 14°37'N and Longitude 93°58'E, Point B: Latitude 14°37'N and Longitude 94°58'E, Point C: Latitude 14°02'N and Longitude 94°58'E and Point D: Latitude 14°02'N and Longitude 93°58'E, and maritime and aerial warnings have been announced.
2. Therefore, during the period of exercise, to ensure safety, the large and small ships, cargo ships, motorboats, fishing boats, and mechanized rafts are strictly prohibited from entering, anchoring, fishing, or deploying fishing equipment within a five-mile radius of the designated area. Moreover, the aircraft and helicopters are also prohibited from flying below an altitude of 15,000 feet over the area during this period. — MNA/KTZH

Paluzawa Bridge on Kalay–Mawlaik Road repaired after PDF arson attack

PDF terrorists and their confederates, under the pretext of working for regional development, have in reality been committing lawless acts of destruction aimed at undermining national stability and peace and disrupting the flow of goods and transport in local areas. Their acts include planting landmines, detonating explosives, and setting fire to roads and bridges used by the public.

In one such incident, on 30 October, PDF terrorists set fire to and destroyed the Paluzawa Bridge, a reinforced concrete bridge measuring 300 feet in length and 18 feet in width, lo-

cated on the Kalay–Mawlaik road connecting Kalay and Mawlaik townships in Sagaing Region. As a result, about 10 feet of the southern deck of the bridge was burnt and damaged, causing serious difficulties for public transport and travel.

To ensure smooth transportation for the public, security personnel stationed in the area immediately undertook repairs on the bridge deck that had been damaged by the arson attack. The repair works were completed on 31 October, allowing pedestrians and vehicles to resume normal travel along the Kalay–Mawlaik road. — MNA/KZL

8th China International Import Expo opens in Shanghai

THE opening ceremony of the eighth China International Import Expo (CIIE), being held from 5 to 10 November, took place at the National Exhibition and Convention Centre (NECC) in Shanghai, China, yesterday.

This year, CIIE features 10 world's top industrial electrical companies, including four major grain traders. The event CIIE will include one main forum, 33 sub-forums and the eighth Hongqiao International Economic Forum.

This year's event features 4,100 overseas exhibitors from 155 countries, regions and international organizations, with the total exhibition area of 430,000 square metres, setting a new record in scale.

During the opening ceremony, Chinese Premier Li Qiang added that new opportunities had been further created and cooperation in global trade will be enhanced.

The booths of Bayer, Siemens and Nestle, which are top in robotic technology, AI, renewable energy, new medicines, household commodities and cosmetics, can be seen at the event, and the number of booths from African regions increased by 80 per cent

compared with the previous year. Moreover, there were also booths of Myanmar showcasing handicrafts, foodstuffs such as

coffee and honey, and agricultural produce.

The booths featured the galleries of relevant countries, medicine and medical supplies, automobiles and high-tech vehicles, food and agricultural products, and import and export products of different countries. The event debuted 461 new products, technologies, and services, highlighting frontier industries such as the low-altitude economy and humanoid robotics.

This year's expo is the first important economic event that China hosts after the fourth plenary session of the 20th Central Committee of the Communist Party of China. According to the data released on 1 October, the Shanghai Customs supervised a total of 4,000 batches of imported CIIE exhibits, with a value of over eight billion yuan. The expo is scheduled to run until 10 November. — Khin Yadana/KTZH

Myanmar Library Association to launch first advanced course on library management & digital literacy

THE Myanmar Library Association will hold its first Advanced Course on Library Organization and Digital Information Literacy (1/2025) online from 1 December 2025 to 5 January 2026, to promote library establishment and develop digital information literacy, according to the association.

Those who have completed the Intermediate Course offered by the association, or who have at least one year of experience in a relevant library and are currently serving in a leadership role, are eligible to attend the advanced course.

This advanced online course will be conducted via the Zoom Meeting application from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm, Monday to Saturday, for one month, with additional sessions from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm as needed. — ASH/TH

Myanmar continues repatriation of foreigners linked to online crimes, illegal entry

ACCORDING to reports, the Government is systematically investigating and identifying foreign nationals who have been residing illegally in border areas and involved in criminal activities such as online gambling and online fraud, and is repatriating them to their respective countries in accordance with the law and established procedures.

During these ongoing operations, 18 foreign nationals, including 15 Filipinos, two Ethiopians, and one Chinese citizen, who had illegally entered Myanmar through border routes via neighbouring countries, including Thailand, and were found to be engaged in online gambling and scamming activities in the Myawady-Maethawtalay (KK Park) area of Kayin State, were recently apprehended.

Myawady District Administration and Management Committee Chairman and District Administrator U Kaung San Lin, together with responsible officials, inspected the ongoing documentation process to record personal details and rele-

vant data of the detainees, and coordinated necessary arrangements to ensure their prompt repatriation through cooperation with departmental teams.

Between 30 January and 5 November 2025, a total of 10,762 foreign nationals who had entered Myanmar illegally were identified and detained. Among them, 9,403 were repatriated in accordance with legal procedures via Thailand to their respective countries, while the remaining 1,359 are now ready for transfer and are being well cared for.

The government continues to actively cooperate with neighbouring and regional countries, as well as international organizations, to effectively uncover, arrest, and take firm action against those involved in online scam centres and the foreign organizers operating behind them. At the same time, Myanmar authorities are coordinating the timely repatriation of foreigners in distress or victims of human trafficking to their home countries. — MNA/KZL

SITE to open four-month training in mid-Dec

SCHOOL of Industrial Training and Education (SITE) will open certificate training in mid-December 2025, including Certificate of Training in Woodworking Technology, Certificate of Training in Basic Industrial Technologies, and Advanced Certificate of Training in Industrial Automation.

Wood Working Technology Training will share knowledge about materials, tools & machines and the Technical Drawing Workshop. Basic Industrial Technologies Training will teach fundamental skills required to manage, operate and maintain electrical and Electronics, Pneumatic and Hydraulics, Machinery and Plant Equipment, Microcontroller Basics, while the Advanced Certificate of Training in Industrial Automation will cover Programmable Logic Controller, Process Control and Process Automation, Factory Automation and Industrial IoT Technology.

Those who have passed the matriculation examination, ITC training, GTHS (BT, MT) and AGTI (Civil) are eligible to attend Woodworking Technology Training. Those who have passed the matriculation examination, ITC training and AGTI (EC, EP, Mech, IE) and those who have completed GTHS (ECT, ET, IT, MT, AMT) are entitled to apply for Basic Industrial Technologies Training.

Those who passed the Basic Industrial Technologies of SITE, AGTI (EC, EP, Mech, IE) and those who hold BTech/BE (EC, EP, Mech, MC) degrees are qualified to apply for the Advanced Certificate of Training in Industrial Automation.

The trainees must be healthy enough to do an internship at factories and companies for practical training. The application form is available at www.site.edu.mm or from 9 am to 4 pm at SITE located at 123, Natmauk Street, Bocho Ward 2, Bahan Township, Yangon. Application must be submitted by 5 December, along with three photos taken within six months, a copy of the relevant certificate, a citizenship scrutiny card (ward administrator's verification and police clearance certificate for those who do not have one). Yangon Port handles 609 container vessels in ten months

A total of 609 container vessels arrived at the Yangon Port in the past ten months of 2025, the Myanma Port Authority announced.

A total of 62 container vessels in January 2025, 53 in February, 58 in March, 62 in April, 65 in May, 62 in June, 60 each

in July and August, 59 in September and 68 in October.

This month, 60 container vessels are scheduled to call at the Yangon Port.

Yangon Port handled 633 container vessels in 2024 and 629 in 2023. Thanks to the draft extension, the international

ocean liners can access the inner port for now, according to the Myanma Port Authority's statement on 22 June 2022.

After the new navigation channel (Kings Bank Channel) accessing the inner Yangon River was found, the draft extension work was accelerated. After that, the port can now handle larger ships. The container vessel MV SITC Zhaoming (185.99-metre LOA, 35.25-metre Beam, 29,232 GRT and 2,698 TEUs) of Hong Kong-based SITC Shipping Line docked at Asia World Port Terminal for the first time on 22 June, which is the largest ship that AWPT Port has handled.

As of May 2021, the number of ships arriving at terminals in Yangon has increased again. Three new container vessels by Maersk Line Myanmar (SeaLand Maersk) started to run to fulfil the seaborne trade requirements in 2021. Earlier, the larger ships had draft problems, preventing sailing on the Yangon River. With the draft being extended up to 10 meters, the larger ocean liners can enter the Thilawa Port. — NN/KK

Agri Dept discusses 2025-26 sugarcane purchase plan

THE Agriculture Department hosted a work coordination meeting with sugar mills to buy sugarcane in the 2025-2026 sugarcane season on 24 October at the meeting hall at Office No 43 in Nay Pyi Taw.

Director-General of the Agriculture Department, chair and executives of Myanmar Sugar and Cane Related Products Association, sugar mill operators and officials of the Sugarcane Research Farm discussed matters related to probability of 29 sugar processing factories to buy all sugarcanes, on-time delivery of sugarcane to factories, implementing contract farming between companies and sugarcane growers, maintenance of sugar mills, maximize energy efficiency, installing new advanced equipment to boost sugar productivity and quality.

The Agriculture Department coordinate matters regarding distributing good sugarcane varieties, providing technical assistance, raising awareness of right time to harvest sugarcane for peak sweetness and post-harvest management to mitigate waste, harvesting sugarcane after measurement with Hand-held Refractometer for sugar concentration and

Brix content, systematic sugarcane crushing, together with traders and growers.

There are a total of 29 sugar processing factories in Myanmar with crushing capacity of 5.37 million tonnes of sugarcane, sugar production of 543,663 tonnes and 261,895 tonnes of syrup in the 2024-2025 financial year. — NN/KK

will be held in 274 constituencies for the Pyithu Hluttaw, 75 constituencies under the First-Past-The-Post (FPTP) system and 26 constituencies under the Proportional Representation (PR) system for the Amyotha Hluttaw, 266 constituencies under the FPTP system, 42 constituencies under the PR system, and 29 ethnic affairs constituencies for the Region or State Hluttaws.

Act Early to Overcome the Danger of Depression

GSHS Survey, mental health problems exist among students aged 13–17.

- * **Feelings of Harm:** Approximately 10.5 per cent of surveyed students reported having attempted to harm or kill themselves in the past 12 months.
- * **Loneliness:** Approximately 11.3 per cent of students reported feeling lonely or secluded in the past 12 months.
- * **Anxiety:** Approximately 6.6 per cent of students reported having their normal sleep disrupted at night due to worry or anxiety in the past 12 months.
- * These data indicate alarming mental health conditions among adolescents in Myanmar.
- * However, due to limited mental health treatment services and the existence of stigma surrounding mental illness in the community, very few people seek treatment.

How to Recognize Depression

The symptoms of depression manifest as psychological, physical, and behavioural changes.

Psychological Symptoms:

- * Feeling sad, hopeless, or low-spirited on a daily basis.
- * Loss of interest in previously enjoyable activities.
- * Feelings of guilt or worthlessness.
- * Increased worry and anxiety.
- * Difficulty concentrating or making decisions.
- * Thoughts of self-harm or suicide (A very critical symptom).

Physical Symptoms:

- * Feeling low on energy, easy fatigue.
- * Changes in sleep patterns (insomnia or excessive sleeping).
- * Changes in appetite (loss of appetite, weight loss, or over-eating, weight gain).
- * Physical pain such as headaches or body aches.
- * Decreased libido.

Behavioural Symptoms:

- * Social withdrawal or isolation.
- * Decline in work or academic performance.
- * Neglecting self-care.
- * Irritability and restlessness.

Why Does Depression Occur?

Depression is not caused by a single factor but often arises from a combination of biological, psychological, and socio-environmental factors.

- **Biological Causes:**
 - * **Brain Chemistry:** Imbalances in neurotransmitters such as Serotonin, Norepinephrine, and Dopamine.
 - * **Hormones:** Thyroid hormone imbalances; hormonal changes during pregnancy and the postpartum period.
 - * **Genetics:** A higher risk for those with a family history of depression.
- **Psychological and Socio-Environmental Causes:**
 - * **Childhood Experiences:** Neglect, abuse, or parental loss in childhood.
 - * **Adverse Life Events:** Traumatic experiences such as grief (loss), the loss of a loved one, financial difficulties, job loss, or marital problems.
 - * **Chronic Illnesses:** Increased stress due to illnesses like cancer, heart disease, or diabetes.
 - * **Medication and Substance Abuse:** Side effects of certain medications, or the use of alcohol and illicit drugs, can contribute to depression.

Types of Depression

Based on the severity and pattern of the illness, depression is primarily classified into the following types:

- * **Major Depressive Disorder (MDD):** The most severe and common type. Characterized by a full set of symptoms lasting for at least two consecutive weeks, significantly impairing daily functioning.
- * **Persistent Depressive Disorder (PDD):** A less severe or moderate form of depression that lasts for at least two years.
- * **Psychotic Depression:** Includes symptoms such as hallucinations or delusions.
- * **Depressive Episode of Bipolar Mood Disorder:** Alternating periods of mania and depression.
- * **Peripartum Depression:** Occurs during pregnancy and up to the first year after childbirth (Requires special attention for maternal health).

maternal health).

- * **Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD):** Depression that specifically occurs during the winter months with less daylight exposure.
- * **Disruptive Mood Dysregulation Disorder:** A type of depression in children and adolescents characterized by severe irritability and frequent angry outbursts.

How is Depression Diagnosed?

Depression cannot be directly identified by physical tests (eg, blood tests). The diagnosis involves the following steps:

- * **Medical History Interview:** The doctor will ask detailed questions about your symptoms, feelings, family history, current medications, and life experiences.
- * **Psychological Assessment:** Standardized mental health questionnaires (eg, PHQ-9) may be used to assess the severity of symptoms.
- * **Physical Examination:** Blood tests, etc., may be performed to rule out other medical conditions (eg, thyroid disease, vitamin deficiency) that could cause depressive symptoms.

The diagnosis requires at least five symptoms, present for at least two consecutive weeks, according to the DSM-5 (Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders) criteria. These symptoms must include either “sadness/depressed mood” or “loss of interest/pleasure.”

What are the Complications of Depression?

If left untreated, depression can severely affect all areas of life:

- * **Personal and Family Life:** Marital problems, family conflicts, and negative impact on children's mental health.
- * **Work and Financial:** Reduced work capacity, job loss, and financial difficulties.
- * **Health:** Worsening of chronic diseases like heart disease and diabetes, and a weakened immune system.
- * **Social:** Breakdown of friendships, social isolation.

ships, social isolation.

- * **Self-Harm:** Increased suicidal ideation and acts of self-harm (leading to loss of life).

It is crucial to be aware that depression is a life-threatening illness.

How Can Depression Be Treated?

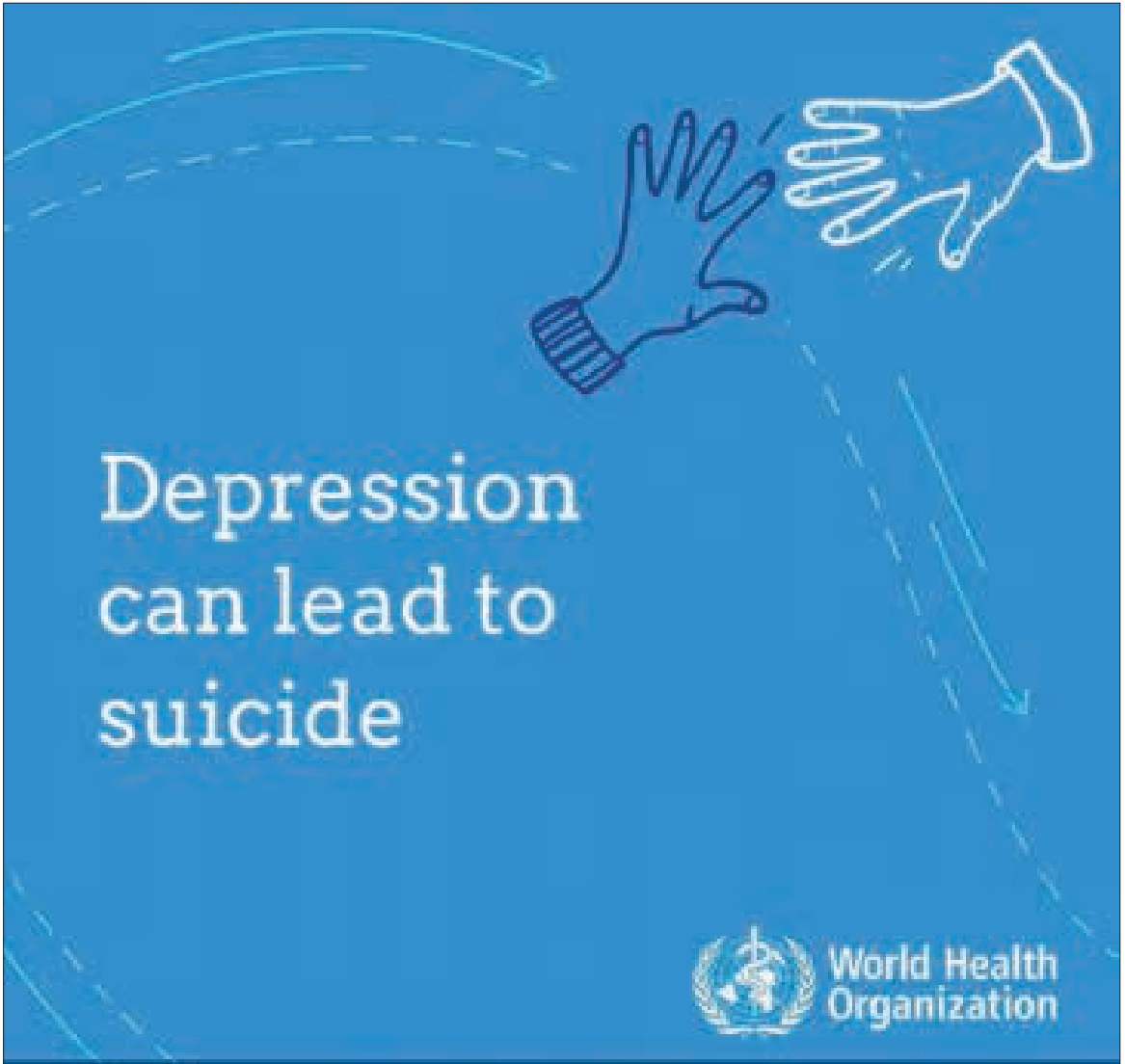
Depression is a treatable illness. There are several treatment methods, and a combination approach is often needed depending on the patient's condition.

- **Psychotherapy:**
 - * **Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT):** Focuses on changing the thinking patterns that contribute to depression.
 - * **Interpersonal Therapy (IPT):** Focuses on resolving social and relationship problems.
- **Medication:**
 - * **Antidepressants:** Types such as SSRIs (Selective Serotonin Reuptake Inhibitors) and SNRIs (Serotonin and Norepinephrine Reuptake Inhibitors) must be taken as prescribed by a doctor. The medication may take several weeks to show effect and must only be stopped after consultation with the doctor.
- **Other Therapies:**
 - * **Electroconvulsive Therapy (ECT):** An effective treatment for severe depression; conducted safely and systematically in modern practice.
 - * **Exercise:** Regular physical activity promotes the release of mood-boosting chemicals in the brain.
 - * **Nutrition:** Consuming foods rich in Omega-3 fatty acids, Vitamin B, and Vitamin D.

How to Prevent Depression

Prevention is more effective than treatment. Depression can be prevented through the following methods:

- * **Improve Social Relationships:** Maintain strong connections with family and friends. Avoid loneliness.
- * **Manage Stress:** Practice yoga, meditation, and breathing exercises.



- * **Regular Physical Activity:** Engage in at least 30 minutes of exercise, such as walking, daily.
- * **Healthy Sleep Pattern:** Get 7-9 hours of sleep per night.
- * **Consume Nutritious Foods:** Eat a balanced diet of fruits, vegetables, and protein.
- * **Avoid Alcohol and Illicit Drugs:** These can worsen depression.
- * **Schedule Rest Time:** Set aside time for self-care and enjoyable activities.
- * **Don't Hesitate to Ask for Help:** Consult a mental health professional if you have experienced traumatic events.

Act Early to Overcome the Danger of Depression

Depression is an illness that can affect anyone; it is not a cause for shame or fear. If you or someone close to you suspects they have symptoms of depression, follow the steps below to overcome this danger:

- * Immediately see nearby healthcare professionals or

- a mental health doctor. Early treatment can prevent complications and lead to a return to a happy and fulfilling life.
- If you are personally experiencing it:
- * Share your feelings with someone you trust. This method will benefit you.
- * Continue engaging in enjoyable activities from your routine to distract yourself.
- * Connect with friends and family members.
- * Take a short walk or engage in regular physical activity.
- * Try your best to maintain regular sleeping and eating patterns.
- * Do not use alcohol or illicit drugs. They can worsen depression.
- * If you feel suicidal, contact someone you trust and seek emergency help.

 12. The Kayin Peoples Party (KPP) will also collaborate with relevant organizations to protect and preserve the natural environment.

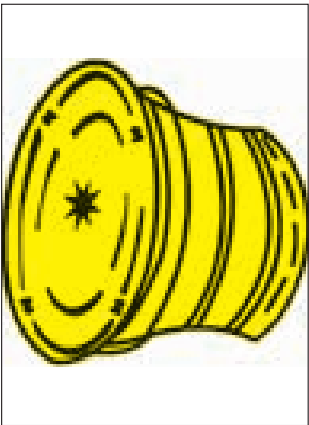

About 200 Myanmar workers arrive in ROK under EPS programme

THE Embassy of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar in Seoul announced on 4 November that approximately 200 more Myanmar workers have been sent to the Republic of Korea under the Employment Permit System (EPS) through the Public Overseas Employment Agency (POEA).

The embassy stated that a total of 46 workers, including 12 new agricultural workers, nine new construction workers, 13 new service workers, and 12 re-entry workers, who were sent through POEA under the EPS system, arrived by Korean Air flight KE492 on 28 October.

Subsequently, 147 new manufacturing workers arrived at

Incheon International Airport on 29 October via Myanmar National Airlines flight UB8301.

The new Myanmar workers were welcomed by the Labour Attaché, who gave instructions on important points the workers should know and abide by, and provided necessary assistance and support.

Additionally, they were briefed that addressing foreign workers in Korea as “Hey” or “You” instead of calling them by their names is considered rude, and the newly arriving Myanmar workers will be required to wear name tags at Incheon International Airport, starting from 28 October, it stated.

UP to 50 workers on leave who would go back to work on their own have been granted Overseas Worker Identification Card (OWIC), according to the Ministry of Labour.

Fifty-three workers, both

male and female, who are going to work in Thailand, Japan, Singapore, Malaysia, the UAE, Qatar, UK, and Macau, have been allowed to apply for OWIC and attend overseas job training on 4 November,

it said.

They will have to do the OWIC application on 7 November and resubmit if they are unable to do so by the schedule. Moreover, more than 40 skilled workers who would go to work abroad on their own have also been allowed to apply for OWIC on 7 November and attend the job training on 6 November. They will need to resubmit if they are unable to do so by the schedule.

Agencies will need to re-submit for permission to send, along with an Excel soft copy of the workers’ list, passport copy and a copy of OWIC, within a week from the date of departure, to dolmigration-japan@gmail.com. — MT/ZS

Myanmar witnesses 2025’s biggest supermoon on 5 Nov

THE biggest and brightest supermoon of 2025 was visible in Myanmar on the night of 5 November, and the last supermoon event for 2025 will occur in December, according to the Myanmar Astronomy & Science Enthusiasts Society (MASES).

The night of 5 November is a full moon night when the biggest and brightest supermoon of 2025 occurred and was visible worldwide, including in Myanmar. This supermoon was the closest to the Earth among all supermoon events in 2025, making it the largest and brightest. It reached its fullest point at around 7:49 pm.

“Why is this supermoon so special? A Supermoon event occurs when a full moon aligns with the Earth at its closest point, known as ‘Perigee’. Because the lunar orbit is elliptical, the distance from the Earth changes constantly, averaging approximately 238,855 miles. On 5 November, the moon is expected to approach about 221,726 miles,” announced the MASES.

Due to this proximity, the moon’s apparent size was 14 per cent larger and 30 per cent brighter than usual, making it one of nature’s most beautiful phenomena.

In 2025, the first supermoon occurred in October, with the second on 5 November and the last on 4 December.

Soe Pyae Htat from MASES advised that, as supermoon events are simply astronomical phenomena occurring in space, they are unrelated to the good or bad fortunes of people on the earth, and it is the best time to observe the full moon if the sky has no clouds. — MT/ZN

US Supreme Court hears challenge to Trump tariff powers

The high court's nine justices will consider Trump's use of emergency powers to impose so-called "reciprocal" tariffs.

THE US Supreme Court will hear arguments Wednesday on whether a wide swath of Donald Trump's tariffs are lawful, in a landmark case that could uphold — or upend — the president's economic agenda.

Billions of dollars in customs revenue and a key lever in Trump's trade wars are at stake, while the conservative-dominated court once again grapples with novel tests of presidential

authority.

Trump has hyped the case as "one of the most important" in US history and warned of calamity if his tariffs are overturned.

The high court's nine justices will consider Trump's use of emergency powers to impose so-called "reciprocal" tariffs on nearly every US trade partner, as well as levies targeting Mexico, Canada and China over their alleged roles in illicit drug flows.

Opponents argue

that such broad tariffs are not permitted by the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA), the law cited by Trump in issuing the levies.

The court's decision, which could take months to arrive, does not concern sector-specific tariffs Trump imposed, including on steel, aluminum and automobiles.

Since returning to the White House, Trump has brought the overall average effective tariff rate to its highest since the 1930s. — AFP

The PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PHDCCI) and the Busan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCCI), South Korea, on Tuesday signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in New Delhi to strengthen bilateral trade and industrial collaboration between India and South Korea. — ANI

S Korea's foreign reserves grow for 5th month in Oct

SOUTH Korea's foreign reserves grew for the fifth straight month in October due to higher return on investment and the issuance of foreign exchange stabilization fund bonds, central bank data showed Wednesday.

Foreign currency reserves advanced US\$6.80 billion from a month earlier to 428.82 billion dollars at the end of October, continuing to go up since June, according to the Bank of Korea (BOK).

The consecutive growth was attributed to the higher invest-

ment return and the sale of foreign exchange stabilization fund bonds amounting to 1.7 billion dollars.

The foreign exchange stabilization fund bonds are sold to raise necessary funds to keep foreign exchange rates stable.

The country's foreign reserves were composed of 377.96 billion dollars of securities, 25.94 billion dollars of deposits, 15.71 billion dollars of special drawing rights, 4.79 billion dollars of gold bullion and 4.41 billion dollars of the IMF position. — Xinhua

New Zealand's financial stability risks remain elevated: Reserve Bank

NEW Zealand's financial stability risks remain higher than in recent years amid fragmentation of global trade and finance,

and ongoing uncertainties, a Reserve Bank report said on Wednesday.

"As a small open economy,

New Zealand would be exposed to any impacts on global economic activity or volatility in financial markets," said a statement of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand after releasing its biannual Financial Stability Report. "Elevated global equity valuations, in areas such as tech stocks, and growing government debt levels in many advanced economies are also vulnerabilities," it said.

"Underperformance in parts of the New Zealand economy, such as retail and hospitality, is creating challenging conditions for households and businesses," said Reserve Bank Governor Christian Hawkesby. — Xinhua

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Toyota lifts FY 2025 net profit outlook even as US tariffs weigh

TOYOTA Motor Corp on Wednesday lifted its net profit outlook for the year through next March to 2.93 trillion yen (\$19 billion) from the earlier estimated 2.66 trillion yen, as higher vehicle sales and the weaker yen help offset the impact of severe US tariffs.

The fallout of the tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump continues to weigh on Toyota, with the world's biggest automaker by volume estimating the blow on its operating profit to total about 1.45 trillion yen for the full

business year, 50 billion yen more than it projected earlier in August.

Still, Toyota revised upward its operating profit outlook to 3.4 trillion yen from the previous forecast of 3.2 trillion yen, on sales of 49 trillion yen, up from the estimate of 48.5 trillion yen.

The Japanese company raised its group vehicle sales outlook for the current fiscal year by 100,000 units to 11.3 million, citing strong demand for its vehicles, especially for its high-end models and hybrids in North America. — Kyodo

Singapore's private sector growth accelerates in Oct: S&P Global

BUSINESS conditions in Singapore's private sector improved further at the start of the fourth quarter, with the seasonally adjusted Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) climbing to 57.4 in October from 56.4 in September, according to a report released Wednesday by S&P Global.

A PMI reading above 50 indicates expansion, while one below 50 signals contraction. The

latest figure marks the ninth consecutive month of growth and the rate of growth since August 2024, the report noted.

"Demand conditions remained robust, spurring job creation and contributing to growth of purchasing activity and inventory levels," said Jingyi Pan, economics associate director at S&P Global Market Intelligence. — Xinhua

8th China International Import Expo opens in Shanghai

THE latest edition of the China International Import Expo (CIIE), the world's first national-level exposition dedicated to imports, opened on Wednesday in Shanghai.

Chinese Premier Li Qiang delivered a keynote speech at the opening ceremony of the eighth CIIE and the Hongqiao International Economic Forum.

It is necessary to uphold equality and mutual benefit, and consolidate the foundation of legitimate common interests, Li said, calling for safeguarding international fairness and justice.

China is willing to work with all parties to promote the implementation of the Global Governance Initiative in international economic and

Bangladesh companies sign deal to buy US\$1B soybeans from US

A consortium of Bangladesh's top three soy crushing companies, Meghna Group, City Group, and Delta Agro, committed to the purchase of US\$1 billion of US soybeans over the following twelve months, a

spokesperson to the US Embassy in Dhaka said on Tuesday.

"The landmark agreement with the US Soybean Export Council (USSEC), a trade association representing the interests of US soybean

farmers abroad, signals a growing export market for high-quality US agricultural products in Bangladesh", said Poornima Rai, spokesperson to the US Mission in Bangladesh.

"US Charge d'Affaires Tracey Jacobson wel-

comed the agreement, underscoring Bangladesh's increasing significance as a key market for US exports and noting that US soybean sales to Bangladesh are expected to triple as a result of this agreement", she added. — ANI

Death toll tops 100 as Philippines digs out after typhoon

Unprecedented floodwaters swept through the province's towns and cities, destroying cars, riverside shanties, and even large shipping containers.

THE death toll from Typhoon Kalmaegi in the central Philippines climbed past 100 on Wednesday as the devastating impact on Cebu province became clearer after the worst flooding in recent memory. Floodwaters described as unprecedented

had rushed through the province's towns and cities a day earlier, sweeping away cars, riverside shanties and even massive shipping containers.

Cebu spokesman Rhon Ramos told AFP that 35 bodies had been recovered from flooded areas of Liloan, a town that is part of provincial capital Cebu City's metro area. The grim news brought the toll for Cebu to 76.

On neighbouring Negros Island, at least 12 people were dead and 12 more were missing after Kalmaegi's driving rain loosened volcanic mudflow which then buried homes in Canlaon City, police Lieutenant Stephen Polinar said.

"Eruptions of Kanlaon volcano since last year deposited volcanic material on its upper sections. When the rain fell, those deposits rumbled down onto the villages," he told AFP.

Only one Negros death had been included in an earlier government tally of 17 deaths outside Cebu. — AFP

US nuclear aircraft carrier arrives at S Korea's Busan port city

US nuclear aircraft carrier, George Washington, arrived at the naval base in South Korea's largest port city of Busan on Wednesday, state media Yonhap reported.

The move the news outlet said is a "reaffirmation of the South Korea-US combined defence posture."

The nuclear powered vessel of Carrier Strike Group 5 is accompanied by a missile cruiser, USS Robert Smalls and USS Milius and USS Shoup Aegis.

The visit is intended to replenish supplies and rest the crew, South Korea's Navy said. — ANI

Zohran Mamdani marks historic NYC win walking off to "Dhoom Machale"

ZOHRAN Mamdani, 34, made history by becoming the first-ever Muslim mayor of New York City and the youngest person to win the mayoral election in a century.

The Democratic socialist defeated former Governor Andrew Cuomo and Republican Curtis Sliwa on the strength of his progressive agenda, signalling both a generational and symbolic shift in New York politics.

Addressing supporters at his victory party, Mamdani said, "My friends, we have toppled a political dynasty. I wish Andrew Cuomo only the best in private life, but let tonight be the final time I utter his name as we turn the page on a politics that abandoned the many and answers only to the few."

The celebratory moment was amplified as the song 'Dhoom Machale' from the Bollywood film 'Dhoom' played in the background, while Mamdani appeared on stage with his wife, Rama Duwaji, and mother, Mira Nair, sending Bollywood fans into a frenzy. — ANI

At least 7 dead after UPS cargo plane crashes near Louisville airport

AT least seven people died and several more were injured after a UPS cargo plane crashed shortly after takeoff on Tuesday from Louisville International Airport in Kentucky, exploding into flames as it crashed into businesses adjacent to the airport.

The US Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) said the McDonnell Douglas MD-11 departing for Hawaii crashed at around 5:15 pm local time (2215 GMT).

Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear told a press briefing that he expected the number of dead and injured was going to rise.

"First responders are onsite and working hard to extinguish the fire and continue the investigation," he posted in a Tuesday night update on X.

UPS said in a statement that three

crew members were on board the aircraft, adding that "we have not confirmed any injuries/casualties."

Beshear said the status of the three crew members was unknown and said

that he was "very concerned" for them.

The cause of the crash was under investigation by the FAA and the US National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB). — AFP

Inter and AC Milan complete purchase of San Siro

INTER Milan and AC Milan moved one step closer to a new stadium of their own on Wednesday after completing the purchase of the iconic San Siro, which is set for demolition.

The two Serie A clubs announced "the signing of the deed of sale with the Municipality of Milan", little more than a month after city approval for the acquisition of the land on which the

stadium sits.

Nicknamed football's La Scala, San Siro is one of the world's most recognizable stadiums and the longtime home of Inter and AC Milan, who between them have been crowned European champions 10 times.

Inter and AC Milan obtained approval to purchase the land for 197 million euros (\$231 million) after over 11 hours of debate and a knife-edge vote at Milan city

hall in the early hours of September 30.

The sale needed to be completed by next Monday, otherwise a public building protection order for the San Siro's second tier would have come into effect.

Now the two clubs can now push ahead with a project worth around 1.2 billion euros which will radically change an area of just over 28 hectares (70 acres) in a densely-populated neighbourhood on the western outskirts of Milan. — AFP

PSG's Desire Doue wins 2025 Golden Boy award

PARIS Saint-Germain attacker Desire Doue won the 2025 Golden Boy award, the Turin-based media outlet Tuttosport reported on Tuesday.

Doue, 20, enjoyed a breakout campaign with PSG last season, logging 16 goals and 16 assists

in 61 games, including two goals and an assist in PSG's 5-0 Champions League final win over Inter Milan.

Doue beat out a number of nominees including Chelsea's Estevao, Real Madrid's Arda Guler and Arsenal's Myles Lewis-Skelly.

The Golden Boy award is given to under-21 footballer rated the best each year, with Barcelona forward Lamine Yamal winning last year's award. Former winners include Lionel Messi, Kylian Mbappe and Wayne Rooney. — Xinhua

Keys withdraws from WTA Finals with illness

The Australian Open champion suffered two defeats in round-robin play this week in Riyadh, to Iga Swiatek and Amanda Anisimova, and had no chance of advancing to Friday's semifinals. At the end of her match against Anisimova on Monday, Keys wouldn't shake her opponent's hand, indicating she was feeling unwell and didn't want to pass on the virus.

"I'm really disappointed to not be feeling my best and ultimately having to withdraw from the tournament. It's a huge accomplishment to make it this far and I'm very proud of myself for doing that and having a great year. I hope to be back next year," said Keys in a statement.

Alexandrova is the second alternate in Riyadh. The first alternate, Mirra Andreeva, who is already competing in the doubles at this year's WTA Finals, elected not to sign in due to not being fit to play on Wednesday.

Andreeva has a doubles match on Thursday, alongside her partner Diana Shnaider, and might be called in for duty as an alternate to replace Jasmine Paolini in singles, given the Italian is no longer in contention for a semi-final spot and is also feeling unwell. — AFP

Beyond limits: Croatian freediver's breathtaking record

FOR almost 30 minutes, Vitimir Maricic didn't take a breath. Face down in a pool, surrounded by anxious onlookers, the Croatian freediver fought spasming pain to redefine what doctors thought was possible. When he finally surfaced, he had smashed the previous Guinness World Record for the longest breath-hold underwater by nearly five minutes.

But even with the help of pure oxygen before the attempt, it had pushed him to the limit.

"Everything was difficult, just overwhelming," Maricic, 40, told AFP, reflecting on the record-breaking day on 14 June 2025.

"When I dive, I completely disconnect from everything, as if I'm not even there.

"This time, I struggled mentally and halfway through I thought about quitting."

Before the record dive, Maricic inhaled pure oxygen deeply

ly for 10 minutes to prepare his body to go so long without fresh air, saturating his blood with oxygen. — AFP

Standing strong together: Russia celebrates National Unity Day

Putin emphasized the undeniable value of Russian unity at the Unity Day state awards ceremony, highlighting the nation's ability to unite against global threats and challenges.

ON National Unity Day, Vladimir Putin laid flowers at the Minin and Pozharsky monument. He also met young volunteers on Red Square and the children of heroes of the special military operation in Ukraine.

"This holiday means unity; it means preservation of our sovereignty, of our country and of our statehood," the Russian president emphasized.

The holiday traces back to 1612, when a people's militia led by Kuzma Minin, elder of the Nizhny Novgorod zemstvo, and Prince Dmitry Pozharsky expelled Polish invaders from Moscow, ending the Time of Troubles.

The fourth of November is celebrated with a wide range of events, from official ceremonies and parades to concerts and public gatherings. Orthodox churches hold services in honour of the Kazan Icon of the Mother of God.

Russian troops are observing the holiday on the front lines of the special military operation.

Iran celebrates victory over Western imperialism

IN Tehran, demonstrators on Tuesday marched from Palestine Square to the former US embassy, where the event ended with speeches, patriotic songs, and the reading of a closing statement condemning Western sanctions and reaffirming solidarity with the Palestinian people.

Hundreds of thou-

sands of Iranians flooded the streets of Tehran and 900+ cities across the country to commemorate the 46th anniversary of the 1979 takeover of the US Embassy — a day officially observed as the National Day of Fighting Global Arrogance.

Crowds marched in unison, waving Iranian flags and portraits of those killed in US and Israeli attacks.

On 4 November 1979, Iranian students seized the US Embassy in Tehran, heralding the beginning of America's expulsion from Iran. The 1979 revolution ended both Western and Israeli influence in Iran by deposing the Pahlavi monarchy. — SPUTNIK

US government shutdown becomes longest in history

THE US government shutdown became the longest ever Wednesday, topping the 35-day record set during Donald Trump's first term, as his administration warned of holiday air travel chaos and threatened Americans' benefits in a bid to force a resolution.

Federal agencies have been grinding to a halt since Congress failed to approve funding past 30 September, and the pain has been mounting as welfare programs — including aid that helps millions of Americans afford groceries — hang in limbo.

There were in recent days the first fragile signs of progress in Congress in the search for an off-ramp, although — for now — 1.4 million federal workers, from air traffic controllers to park wardens, remain on enforced leave or working without pay.

Hours before the shutdown record toppled at midnight, the Trump administration sounded the alarm over turmoil at airports nationwide if the crisis drags beyond a sixth week, with worsening staff shortages snarling airports and closing down sections of airspace. — AFP
